A typical day in Early Years, Gold and Silver Classes.

- Ready, Steady, Go Time and Registration.
- Children are encouraged to work independently, in small groups, teacher led groups or individually.
- Children have a snack at the snack bar when there is a natural break in their learning.
- They have a variety of child initiated learning and teacher focused learning.
- When the children are settled in, we will group them in small groups named after colours/animals etc. This is mainly for organisation and to ensure a fair mix of directed teaching time and developing their own interests during child initiated learning.
- The children have access to outdoor learning throughout the day where they can access the seven areas of learning.

In the mornings and at home time...

- In the mornings you will enter the playground from the small gate and walk through the playground where you can say goodbye to your child. They will be met by a member of staff and taken to their classroom.
- In the classroom there will be a selection of free choice learning for your child to choose.
- Please use the same system for home time and collect your child from the gate in our garden and by the steps. We finish school at 3.15pm.
- Please keep younger children close to you to keep them safe in the car park and away from the cars.

School readiness

- Starting Infant School is an exciting new chapter in your child's life. We are aware of the importance of this big step, and are dedicated to helping children settle in quickly, build positive relationships and enjoy school life.
- At Walsh, we understand that it can feel daunting when your child starts 'big school', so we have complied some helpful tips about the learning behaviours we foster in EYFS and some ideas to get your child off to a great start in

developing these skills, these are in your welcome pack.

- We want our children to have:
- have strong social skills
- can cope emotionally with being separated from their parents
- are relatively independent in their own personal care
- have a curiosity about the world and a desire to learn





Key practical skills for school

There's a whole range of practical skills that will come in handy during a busy school day. If children have practised each of these before they start school, it can help them to be independent and feel confident:

- Recognising their name please label all their clothes
- Going to the toilet on their own and washing hands
- Putting their coat and shoes on learning to be independent
- Dressing this is another key skill that will really help us.
- **Eating** whether having a school or a packed lunch, helping your child prepare for lunchtime is very beneficial.

Not all children develop at the same pace.

• If your child can't do all these things perfectly before they start school, don't panic, we always get to know them and start their learning where they are and they will get there in the end with your help and encouragement. Do let us know about any concerns and that way we will be ready to help.




Autumn Term One – Marvellous Me


Our curriculum is designed to inspire a love of learning through interesting and exciting topics. Although we have a plan for the year, we do base our learning on the interests of the children.

Attendance



- We continually focus on the importance of attendance and punctuality to ensure that your child has the best possible start in life.
- All holiday's in term time are discouraged
- We will update you on your child's attendance every half term with a RAG rated letter of attendance. All absences below 90% is classed as Persistently Absent and we will work with you to help improve this.

A few things to remember!

- Please label everything!
- Absence from school always phone the office in the morning
- Book bags and water bottles
 – please bring into school everyday and check book bag every evening
- Jewellery children are only allowed to wear small stud earrings and not for PE
- Newsletters- these are full of information and are sent weekly
- School dinners- we would encourage all children to have a school dinner and can help support them if they need help trying new foods.
- Any concerns or worries please speak to your class teacher so we can support you or speak to or email the office and they will pass your message to the class teacher.
